Big Brothers Big Sisters Mentoring: La Salle College Bigs Program

Where Learning Goes Beyond Books into Learning to Make a Difference

The Bigs in our School Based mentoring programs fill a void in a child's life by spending one-on-one time with them during the school day. We build partnerships with schools throughout the region, and match volunteers with children from local elementary and middle schools. In **La Salle College Bigs** program, volunteers ("Bigs") from La Salle University visit their mentees ("Littles") at Logan Elementary School. No matter what they do together, the time spent between these Bigs and Littles is proven to enhance school performance.

Volunteer Time Commitment

One hour every week for nine months, while Littles are in school.

What Bigs and Littles Do Together

Talk, shoot hoops, play games or do craft projects together. Logan Elementary School has dedicated space, activities and games for Bigs and Littles. "Brown Bag" your lunch and eat with your Little!

When You Meet

During lunch, usually between 11:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m., depending on your Little's lunch schedule. The day of the week is flexible!

Where You Meet

Logan Elementary School (17th and Lindley Ave) – a short distance from campus!

Program Results

Children in our School Based mentoring programs show:

- an increase in academic performance
- feel more competent academically
- are less likely to skip school
- feel that they will attend and finish college
